The meeting was called to order at 1:31 p.m. The roll of voting members was taken and there was a quorum.

Wally Darter moved to approve the agenda. Jack Davis seconded and the motion carried.

Daniel Franks moved to approve the minutes of the July 31, 2018 meeting. Tonya Woods seconded and the motion carried.

**Old Business**

**RHSOC Committee Status / Rotation of members / Chair and Vice-Chair elections**

Steve stated that it is time to rotate representatives for some sectors.

In regard to the Private Industry/Public Utility sector, Eddie Calhoun will move into the primary position and Perry Street will move into the alternate position. Motion to move Eddie Calhoun in primary position and Perry Street in the secondary position was made by Daniel Franks. Beverly Hicks seconded the motion and the motion carried.

In regard to the Emergency Medical Service sector, Jack Davis will remain the primary position for a two-year term, leaving the alternate position open. Motion to retain Jack Davis in primary position and leave the alternate position open was made by Mark Arnold. Wally Darter seconded the motion and the motion carried.

In regard to the #911 sector, Jeff Holman will remain in the alternate position for a two-year term. Motion to accept Jeff Holman in alternate position was made by Jack Davis. Tim Schook seconded the motion and the motion carried.

In regard to the Director of Emergency Management sector, Mike Coldiron will move into the primary position and Kent Edge will move into the alternate position. Motion to move Mike Coldiron in primary position and Kent Edge in the secondary position was made by Jeff Holman. Mark Arnold seconded the motion and the motion carried.

In regard to the Chief of Police sector, Wally Darter will move to the primary position, leaving the alternate position open. Motion to move Wally Darter in primary position, leaving the

alternate position open was made by Jeff Holman. Beverly Hicks seconded the motion and the motion carried.

In regard to the City or County Public Works sector, Rob Rackley will move to the primary position, leaving the alternate position open. Motion to move Rackley in primary position, leaving the alternate position open was made by Wally Darter. Jack Davis seconded the motion and the motion carried.

In regard to the Volunteer sector, Robin Walters will move in the primary position, and Jenny Solomon will move into the alternate position. Motion to accept Robin Walters in primary position and Jenny Solomon in the alternate position was made by Mark Arnold. Wally Darter seconded the motion and the motion carried.

In regard to the Education sector, Tonya Woods will remain in the primary position, and the alternate position will remain open. Motion to accept Tonya Woods in primary position, leaving the alternate position open was made by Roy Sims. Wally Darter seconded the motion and the motion carried.

In regard to the GIS sector, Melanie Barnett will be inserted into the alternate position. Motion to accept Melanie Barnett in the alternate position was made by Wally Darter. Mark Arnold seconded the motion and the motion carried.

#### **Grant Updates: FY2016 – FY2017**

Jessica said that the FY2015 and FY2016 grants are closed. In regard to the FY2017 grant, trauma kits have been ordered for \$7,002.80, leaving a balance of approximately \$5,000. The GIS balance is approximately \$310. The total unobligated funds are \$5,427.50. After group discussion about the leftover funds it was decided to purchase as many kits as possible with those unobligated funds. Wally Darter made a motion to use the remaining balance for law enforcement kits. Jeff Holman seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Jessica added that in regard to the 2018 funds, all additional granted funds has gone towards sustainment, and she is working on the sub awards now.

Michelle said that the FY2018 applications should be coming back for corrections in the next few weeks. FY2018 funds require a cybersecurity element now, and she went on to discuss training funding.

Jessica asked the group if anyone who had requested radios had still not received those yet, as she has heard from two who have had this issue. She asked those present to let her know if there are any further problems with those radios.

#### **Region G Training & Exercise**

Mark Arnold said that the aircraft rescue classes had to be rescheduled to January 12, 2019 with a backup date of January 19, 2019 in Houston. The class will be held on February 9, 2019 in Pomona. There will be a vehicle rescue class in Houston November 30, 2018 and December 1, 2018. There will be firefighter 1 & 2 trainings the first three weeks of November, and Van Buren will host a basic firefighter class in January. On January 19, 2019 there will be a weekend IS300 class in West Plains. The first weekend in February, a winter firefighting class will be held.

JJ outlined the upcoming SEMA courses and added that by the first of the year, awards for requests will go out.

The Health Department Prep exercises are coming up. Those will be held in Ozark County on November 7, 2018, Douglas County on November 27, 2018, and in Oregon County on November 29, 2018.
