Randy Pamperien called the meeting to order at 11:00 AM. An introduction of guests and members was made at this time.

Motion to approve the April 16, 2024 minutes was made by Terry Newton and seconded by David Stubblefield. All were in favor. Motion carried.

New Business

Southeast District Projects and Happenings – MoDOT Reps.

Elquin said that most projects are currently paving projects. She then outlined some of the other current projects including a bridge project in Koshkonong and she added that the Ava roundabout is done. They are currently working on adding shoulders on 160 from West Plains to Route 99. Michael added that they are waiting on the Governor to sign the budget, and on July 25 an unfunded needs list meeting will be held. He said that the draft STIP is out, and the public comment period is now and they are hoping to get approval in July.

Approve FY24 Regional Transportation Plan

Trent said that every year the plan is updated. This year, a complete update was done with demographics. The plan is on the SCOCOG website. This fiscal year, the plan is to update the maps. Motion to approve the FY24 Regional Transportation Plan as presented was made by Zach Williams and seconded by Ron Scheets. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Approve FY25 MoDOT Work Plan

Trent said that nothing has changed with the plan, and it will go into effect July 1. It is mandatory to complete through MACOG. Trent added that at MACOG, multi-modal transportation advisory committee options were discussed. Each RPC was given the opportunity to adjust their existing TAC or create a new multi-modal group. Of the three alternatives, option three, to add multi-modal to the TAC was decided on. Motion to approve the FY25 MoDOT Work Plan as presented was made by Scott Long and seconded by Brad Loveless. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Open Discussion

Randy asked how much was budgeted for I-70; Michael Brandon said \$2 billion. Joe added that the MoDOT website has an overview of the project.

Trent distributed a sheet of eligible activities by program from SEMA and FEMA. He said that it lists possible funding for disasters. Projects listed may be eligible for funding if it is in a declared disaster area.

The next TAC meeting will be held **August 20, 2024.**

There being no other business to discuss, motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Terry Newton and seconded by Scott Long. All were in favor. The motion carried at 11:41 AM.
